
Indian Registry System – A Novel Data Source

- IRS registry received at ICES from Aboriginal Affairs Canada
- Contains information on all Registered/Status First Nations in Ontario, living both on- and off-reserve as of June 2013
- Data elements
 - Individual identifiers for linkage (names, sex, date of birth)
 - Band affiliation
 - Date of registration
 - Record status (e.g. active, inactive, confirmed death)
 - Province of residence when registered
 - Residence status (on reserve / off reserve)
 - Parent-child relationships
 - Marital status



IRS Data - Linkage Analysis

- 176,266 (83%) of Ontario residents recorded in IRS have been linked to ICES Registered Persons Database (RPDB)
 - 10% did not link to RPDB due to death date prior to 1990
