## Memory Length Determination for Categorical Longitudinal Data

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**Abstract:** Given a longitudinal categorical data box

 $S := \{ (x_{ij}(t) | 1 \le i \le m, 1 \le j \le n, t = 0, 1, 2, \dots \},\$ 

where *i*s are the panel identification indexes, *j*s the variable indexes, *t*s the time indexes. Let  $X := (x_1, \ldots, x_n)$  be the joint distribution of the variables  $v_1, \ldots, v_n$ . We may and shall regard this box as an empirical realization of a stochastic process. This process can be Markov or non-Markov. We apply our dependence degree measure  $\omega^{u|v}$  and its variations to determine the memory length for the empirical process, and discuss its relative issues.
